Our schools, that is you, are generally highly valued by parents and authorities, and not just because of academic achievements of which we are rightly proud. We are committed to an understanding of education that because we believe in the unique value of each individual, created by God for good, we acknowledge the worth of every person as made in that image of God. We need to find ways of making sure that the world sees and values this as our contribution to society, something that society needs so much in today's world.

**Secondary RE** May I welcome Secondary colleagues back to school for the new academic year. With so many recent changes in the field of Religious Education this is both an exciting and challenging time to teach RE! I hope to agree dates for GCSE and A Level leaders to meet each term to look at progress in delivering the new specifications and to share our experiences and resource ideas. Don't forget to utilise the Dropbox facility set up last term to provide colleagues in other schools the benefits of your creativity. All our departments have so much to offer! Can I remind RE subject leaders that we have the first meeting on 8 November 2016. I have invited the CAFOD national Secondary adviser Susan Kambalu to join us on the day. She has a wealth of valuable experience to share.

**People of God** – Called to Serve In the last few weeks the first four Year 9 framework units have gone live on the People of God website. I would encourage you to review these units which have been specifically designed to prepare students for and, in effect, start work towards the new GCSE. One or two schools have not yet subscribed to People of God. I would encourage you to do so since this will be the standard against which KS3 curriculum RE will be judged during future S48 inspections.

**Inspection Team Meetings** Inspection colleagues are reminded that we are now scheduled to meet on 4 November 2016 [also 10 March 2017, 22 June 2017]. Our work was very successful last year and we are now in line with the required programme of inspections. There will be a number of both S48 and IMV events this Advent term. **RE Subject Leader Meetings** - Please let me know the dates of these meeting as I really want to attend to work alongside you and support you in your role..

**Levels of Attainment** - Thank you to everyone who completed the national questionnaire on the levels of attainment. The responses have now been collated and were shared with the RE Advisers at a national meeting on 21 September. Hopefully soon we will have a clear way forward.

**Live Simply** - Hopefully by now you will have received a letter regarding the Cafod 'Live Simply' Challenge. This monthly challenge encourages us to look at our personal responsibility for making choices that will enable us to live simply, sustainably and in solidarity with the poor. I've already noticed a difference in the office for September's challenge! Have a look at our website to see what's coming next in the October challenge.

**Sex and Relationship Education** - This has been a work in progress for many months or even years. The material is now available in draft form on the CES website. An email copy has also gone out to all Head Teachers. Please note that if you do anything with it, at this stage, it is only in draft form.

**Come and See** - The content of the programme is being reviewed. Years 6,5 and 4 have been completed. The updated texts, questions and activities are now available on the Come and See website. We hoe Y3 will be available in the new year.

**A Heart that Sees** is a Year of Mercy Legacy Resource. The document does not yet exist! It will be produced from schools across the country, including our schools, with initiatives already implemented in the Year of Mercy. We need five schools who would be willing to share something of what they have done over the year: practical activities - acts of visible compassion – gestures of love in action - reaching out to parents / the local community. You may not have even seen them as an act of mercy. It is a gesture, which your school has offered, which addresses a genuine need. It may be quite a small or simple thing. But it is a gesture of a deeper virtue, a value in action. Jo Perrett (St Bernard's Prep School) represents our Diocese at a national level and she will email any school a proforma for you to easily feedback on what has been achieved, in terms of practical help during the Year of Mercy, in your school. It's an exciting prospect to have your gestures included in a national project. If you are interested in taking part please email me by October half term.

**Missio** - I have been approached by the Education Co-ordinator of Missio - the Catholic Church's official charity for overseas mission. They work in 157 countries throughout the world bringing the hope of the Gospel where there is turmoil, poverty and uncertainty, and where the Church is new, young or poor. Missio empowers local people to form and sustain communities of faith and they train and nurture future leaders so that the vital work of the Church in the world can take place.
