

## CCRS (and DCRS) Course 2020-2021

The course, which can be undertaken as full CCRS or through the Diocesan Certificate, consists of eight modules, six core theological modules in and two specialist modules designed to engage students in areas of professional or individual interest such as teaching, Catechesis and parish work. ## Bishops' Conference of England and Wales Catholic Certificate in Religious Studies (and the DCRS)

CCRS is a nationally accredited course in Catholic theology and its application in Religious Education, Catechesis and parish life. It is valuable for all teachers and an essential requirement for those teachers applying for senior management positions in Catholic education. We recommend following the Northampton Diocesan Certificate in Religious Education for those wishing to grow and deepen their knowledge of their faith or in preparation for greater involvement in parish life without the need to complete CCRS assignments.

Each route through the course consists of six core modules in foundational areas of theology (Old and New Testament, Morality, Church, Jesus Christ and The Sacraments) and two specialist modules.

### General Requirements for each module:

- 10 hours of teaching over two days
- A written assignment( CCRS) or short reflective log (DCRS)
- Minimum of 80% attendance over the whole course

**Cost:** £20 registration fee plus £65 per module for those following CCRS or £45 per module following DCRS
