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## *From the Episcopal Vicar*

If you were asked what is the opposite to faith, most people answer immediately with "doubt". Yet in a discussion this summer someone argued very powerfully that the opposite to faith is certainty. An American writer, Brené Brown, has also said: "Faith minus vulnerability and mystery equals extremism." This made me ask questions about how we set out our stall in Catholic education and catechesis, and whether we are being overtaken by another agenda to our own. We need, yes, always to be the best professionally in our education and catechesis – standards, resources, pedagogy etc. But we do not subscribe to a world view that is absolute in itself. We do not have all the answers. Faith is not certainty, but rather faith is always seeking to enter further into the mystery that is our God in Jesus Christ. We know we have the truth of faith, but there is still so much to be revealed, ultimately when we meet God face to face, and see him as he really is (1 John 3:2). That is why we find problems with fundamentalism in our own or any belief system so threatening, because it relies on human certainty. Our hope as teachers and catechists must be to foster faith in our young people. This will allow questions and challenges, but also will depend on our own witness of faith. As Pope Paul VI said so powerfully: "Modern man listens more willingly to witnesses than to teachers, and if he does listen to teachers, it is because they are witnesses." Our Education Week and celebration this year provides us an opportunity to think again about how we foster the faith of our young people and their families. It is very important for us to begin now in September to make sure people are aware of the Week in our schools and parishes. How will we use the week to let the people of the parishes know the work of our schools and their place in the mission of the Church of our diocese. Elsewhere you will see news about Proclaim 15 the evangelisation initiative of our bishops. The work of our schools and catechists is an integral and essential part of this mission.

## SECONDARY RE AND INSPECTION

**Inspection. 2014/15** has been an interesting year in which the Ofsted Section 48 process has settled to a new pattern after a time of change and during which we have begun to implement the Interim Monitoring Visit [IMV] process. The number of both will pick up somewhat during the year ahead. Schools that have experienced IMVs seem to have found them both useful and a positive experience. Our inspection team meetings during the coming year will be on 15 October 2015, 15 March 2016 and 15 July 2016. There is no special significance in this occurrence of dates! All team members are most welcome. Please place these dates in your diary. Thank you.

**Bishops' Statement/Guidance on GCSE RE.** From September 2015 schools will be making their choice of exam board and specifications for GCSE RE. Exam boards have now produced draft specifications following the DfE criteria and we can now see what

specific options will be available. Colleagues will be reviewing these in order to decide which board and specification to use from September 2016 and to prepare for teaching in the following year. It is clear that, in order for our Catholic schools to teach a GCSE which serves the purposes of Catholic Religious Education and meets the requirements of the Religious Education Curriculum Directory, only a small range of options from the choices available would be appropriate. Schools in the diocese should select from those specifications which allow:

1. A study of Catholic Christianity as Religion 1
2. A 50% study of Catholic Christianity, covering all four topics:
  - Beliefs and teachings
  - Practices
  - Sources of Wisdom and Authority
  - Forms of Expression and Ways of Life
3. A study of Judaism as Religion 2

The reformed RE GCSE is a great improvement on the existing GCSE examination, and represents an unprecedented opportunity to make a real difference to the quality of Religious Education as it is offered in our Catholic secondary schools.

**Secondary Religious Education.** May I take this opportunity to offer all secondary colleagues every good wish for the new academic year and to congratulate departments on what has been another very good year for GCSE and A level results in Religious Education in our schools. RE subject leader meetings for the next year are on 23 October 2015 and 11 March 2016. The annual RE conference is on 17 June 2016. This will be much more geared to secondary colleagues in 2016. More details will follow! Please note these dates in your diary and do your best to meet with colleagues on these occasions.

**Remember that we keep the Year of Consecrated Life** until 2 February 2016. Pray for all the religious sisters and brothers who have served our Catholic schools, and for vocations to the religious life. Try to list any who served in your school

### NCTL Scholarships for governor programmes and workshops

The CES and dioceses are encouraging governors in Catholic schools to take advantage of the training courses and workshops currently offered or licensed by the NCTL. There will be many new governors starting a term of office in September there and a number of people would find them extremely useful. The courses are as follows.

#### Chairs' of Governors Leadership Development

**Programme** for aspiring chairs of governors, new chairs or existing chairs who would like to develop their skills further. The programme is delivered through workshops, school-based activities and includes the support of a mentor. It focuses on the role of the chair, leading the governing body and leading change and continuous improvement – all of which can help governing bodies build capacity and support succession planning. The RRP for the programme is £399 and it is delivered through NCTL approved licensees. However, scholarships are available of £320 for small schools and £200 for all other maintained schools towards the cost of the programme.

**Workshops:** NCTL has also developed workshops for governors on RAISEonline, performance-related pay and financial efficiencies, which are 3 hour sessions that governors can book onto, free of charge.

**Clerks:** This programme is aimed at new and experienced clerks wanting to develop their skills. Scholarships are also available for this programme.
