POPE FRANCIS - A HOLY YEAR OF MERCY 8 DECEMBER 2015 until 20 NOVEMBER 2016

Every 25 years the Popes call a Jubilee Year, inviting people on pilgrimage to Rome. It originates in the Jewish tradition of a year of forgiveness of debt. Pope Francis has called an extraordinary Jubilee Year dedicated to his constant theme of mercy.

"I am convinced that the whole church -- that has much need to receive mercy because we are sinners -- will find in this jubilee the joy to rediscover and render fruitful the mercy of God, with which we are all called to give consolation to every man and woman of our time,"

Let us not forget that God pardons and God pardons always.

"Let us never tire of asking for forgiveness."

From the beginning Pope Francis has emphasised the need for the Church to be God's mercy to the world. He has witnessed to this himself in many of his own actions towards the poor and the needy, washing the feet of prisoners on Holy Thursday, reaching out to the sick wherever he goes. We are looking to find ways of celebrating this Year in the diocese, especially in our schools. One thought for you is that at the beginning of the year the Pope will open the Holy Door in St Peter's, a door that is otherwise always sealed up. It becomes the door for pilgrims to enter the basilica. Is there in our schools or parishes a doorway or entrance that could be set apart as a special place for the year, so that every time people move through it they are reminded of God's mercy to them and the mercy they need to show to others? We welcome suggestions to share!

WITNESSING TO OUR FAITH

This year has seen so many Christians killed for their faith in different parts of the world. Many of the young people and families of our schools and parishes have links to those situations in Pakistan, India, Kenya, Nigeria and elsewhere. Firstly we must find every way possible of being solidarity through prayer and support for those communities, especially in the Middle East, Christ's own countries. Secondly it asks us to take seriously how we witness to Christ in this land where we have such freedom in comparison. Many question whether as Christians we are too timid to stand up for our beliefs here. This is something we need to help our young people understand and respond too positively.

SISTER AIDAN is retiring from her work as Primary RE Adviser from the end of this academic year, although she will still be willing and available to help in different ways wherever she can. We want to celebrate her generous service to the diocese as a member of the NORES team for so many years, and before her work teaching in our schools. Bishop Peter will celebrate a thanksgiving mass on Monday 6 July at 7pm here with NORES in the Holy Ghost Church. It will be a lovely occasion and a chance for us all to gather together to celebrate what we value in religious education. I hope as many as possible will book the date now and try to be there. More details will follow in due course.

NEWS FROM THE PRIMARY CORNER

Rise heart; thy Lord is risen.
Sing his praise without delays,
Who takes thee by the hand,
that thou likewise with him mayst rise.

"We bring you the good news that what God promised to the fathers, this day he has fulfilled to us their children by raising Jesus." (Acts 13:32,33) The Resurrection of Jesus is the crowning truth of our faith believed and lived as the central truth by the first Christian community; handed on as fundamental by tradition; established by the documents of the New Testament; and preached as an essential part of the Paschal mystery along with the cross (CCC 638). Jesus really did rise from the dead as we read in the New Testament, and "I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received, that Christ died for our sins..... and that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the scriptures" (1 Cor. 15:3-4) and that he appeared to the disciples. It is significant for us women that the first to acknowledge the resurrection were the women who went to anoint Jesus' body. They were followed by Peter and John. John arrived first as he could run faster than Peter, but he didn't go in before Peter arrived, acknowledging Peter as being superior to himself. Once John saw the linen cloths lying there, "he saw and he believed" (Jn. 20:2). On a number of occasions Jesus actually appeared, not only to the Apostles but, at one time to more than five hundred persons. The disciples had received such a great shock at the crucifixion that it was difficult for them to believe in the resurrection to start with. We see this in the account of the disciples who took a walk away from Jerusalem to think things over and express to each other their hopes and dreams. So what does this all mean for us? Do we too believe that Jesus rose again? That he gave us all a new life? That he died for our sins and the sins of the world? Do we have hopes and dreams for our own future? Let us look at our world and, seeing all the newness of life around us, rejoice in the newness we have received, and with the children, give thanks and praise to God our Father.



2015 has been dedicated to the Consecrated Life by Pope Francis. We hope that schools are continuing to think about this and pray with thanks for all those women and men religious who have

given their lives for Catholic education as well as so many other ministries in the Church over the centuries. Many of our schools were established by religious orders and more also staffed by them until recent times. It would be very good if we could gather together in the next months information about all the religious who have worked in our schools over the years. Some will be very obvious where the order ran the school, but in many places sisters worked in the diocesan schools. We also have the situation of schools which have closed. So look up your history and let us know!

Salt & Light Project

is NYMO Young Leaders' Programme, for 16 - 18 year olds who wish to take on a leadership role within the school, parish or local community, alongside work or study. Each young person plans their own project, which could be a one off event day or an on-going project in one of these three settings. They reflect upon their skills and as they prepare in a structured way and with the help of an adult mentor. Reflective practice is an invaluable way for young people to look at their work and initiate improvements: a valuable skill in the eyes of employers and educators.

RE Subject Leaders' meeting

Despite a full agenda I had to cancel this term's RE Subject leaders' meeting because so few colleagues were able to attend. With so many developments in the local and national RE world, I would like to establish a new date for this meeting after the Easter break. I will be writing to colleagues shortly with this in mind. I know time is very precious, but would encourage colleagues to do their best to attend since time together provides a valuable opportunity for the exchange of ideas and experience.

People of God – Called to Serve. Year 7 of the new Framework for Religious Education in Catholic schools will be published on-line by Matthew James in early May 2015 and will be available on subscription for only £300x for the first three years. The package will include a growing number of teaching resources to support the units of study and the introduction of the framework for Years 8 and 9 over the coming year. Since it is likely that Northampton and many other dioceses will adopt this as the basis for teaching in KS3, I would recommend that all schools subscribe and have access to *People of God – Called to Serve* from an early date.

Cafod and People of God – Called to Serve The Cafod Secondary writing team has been closely involved in the writing of the new KS3 Framework for Religious Education. As well as contributing to the soon-to-be-published Year 7 materials, they have written Year 8 unit 6 [on the challenge to live justly] which will go on-line this May along with the Year 7 framework and resources. The People of God – Called to Serve website will link to the Cafod website where subscribers will be able to find a wealth of resources to support teaching. Cafod resources will be found throughout the Framework where appropriate.

PACT

The recent Diocesan Schools' Commissioners' Conference highlighted the work of PACT, a national charity that provides practical and emotional support to children affected by the imprisonment of a family member, and to their families. PACT is a member of the Caritas Social Action Network and its President is Cardinal Vincent Nichols. PACT has just published a Charter for Children and Young People with a Family Member in Prison. It has also produced a Practical Toolkit for Catholic Schools and parish communities on meeting the educational and pastoral care/welfare needs of children who are affected by the imprisonment of a family member, as well as useful books and other resources on this topic.

Universal infant free school meals (UIFSM): funding allocations 2015 to 2016

Please see below a copy of a communication received from the Department for Education.

'The department has today published the details and calculator for the universal infant free school meals (UIFSM) provisional and final allocations for the 2015-2016 UIFSM grant to schools. For the academic year 2015 to 2016, a provisional allocation of UIFSM grant to schools will be based on the final allocation for academic year 2014 to 2015. A final allocation for academic year 2015 to 2016 will be calculated in June 2016, based on take-up recorded in the October 2015 and January 2016 School Censuses. The conditions of grant also confirms that the rate per meal will remain at £2.30 for the 2015-16 academic year.

In addition to the main allocations above, schools with 150 or fewer pupils on roll (including nursery classes), as recorded on the January 2015 School Census will receive an extra flat payment of £2,300, in recognition of the additional costs that small schools incur.

Pentecost Novena 2015

The Diocesan Evangelisation Team, in partnership with others, is again seeking to encourage simple prayer services around the Diocese during the nine days leading up to Pentecost. On each of the nine days of the novena the aim is that there will be at least one group praying this novena somewhere in the Diocese of Northampton in our parishes, schools, prayer groups, homes and elsewhere. For schools there will be a Poetry Competition for Key Stages 2 and 3 creatively expressing Pentecost with book tokens, prizes and assembly ideas.
