We begin February with the great feast of **The Presentation of the Lord in the Temple**, where he is acclaimed as the light of the nations by Simeon and Anna.

The feast marks the end

of Christmas time. It is when all candles are blessed for the coming year. We often use it to ask people to bring/buy a candle that will be their prayer candle for the coming year – something that you might do around this time for each class. The image of light is constantly used in the scriptures for the mission of the Church. We need to bring the light that is Christ to all people, to the work that we do, to the lives that we lead. At the induction of a head teacher in our diocese NORES offers them a lighted candle as a sign of their leadership and mission. Elsewhere we offer a renewal of commitment for all staff to the mission of our schools. It may be something you might use now or at the beginning of a school year, to include all staff in this work we undertake together.

The month will end with us in Lent. We move into a period when we are waiting and preparing for the great light of Easter. We have 40 days to reflect, to pray, to do good works. For most of us Ash Wednesday will fall in half term. That does not mean we cannot keep some form of Ash Wednesday liturgy before or after the day itself. It would be great to think that all would be at church on the day, and you can help that by letting families know when the parishes will celebrate their Ash Wednesday liturgy. Then we need to think how we will make the Lenten journey this year. What will be its focus? How we will ensure that it is journey we make together with Christ and one another as he makes his way to the Cross and to the glory of the Resurrection at Easter 2015.



LENT

Following on from the last NORES NEWS I thought these comments from Pope Francis give us significant food for thought about our work from his Apostolic Exhortation – Evangelii Gaudium (The Joy of the Gospel)

Culture, thought and education

132. Proclaiming the Gospel message to different cultures also involves proclaiming it to professional, scientific and academic circles. This means an encounter between faith, reason and the sciences with a view to developing new approaches and arguments on the issue of credibility, a creative apologetic which would encourage greater openness to the Gospel on the part of all. When certain categories of reason and the sciences are taken up into the proclamation of the message, these categories then become tools of evangelization; water is changed into wine. Whatever is taken up is not just redeemed, but becomes an instrument of the Spirit for enlightening and renewing the world.

133. It is not enough that evangelizers be concerned to reach each person, or that the Gospel be proclaimed to the cultures as a whole. A theology – and not simply a pastoral theology – which is in dialogue with other sciences and human experiences is most important for our discernment on how best to bring the Gospel message to different cultural contexts and groups. The Church, in her commitment to evangelization, appreciates and encourages the charism of theologians and their scholarly efforts to advance dialogue with the world of cultures and sciences. I call on theologians to carry out this service as part of the Church's saving mission. In doing so, however, they must always remember that the Church and theology exist to evangelize, and not be content with a desk-bound theology.

134. Universities are outstanding environments for articulating and developing this evangelizing commitment in an interdisciplinary and integrated way. Catholic schools, which always strive to join their work of education with the explicit proclamation of the Gospel, are a most valuable resource for the evangelization of culture, even in those countries and cities where hostile situations challenge us to greater creativity in our search for suitable method

(L) In the name of the Lord I accept your promises

We say together

This is our mission and ministry. This is the ministry of the Church.

We accept it with joy. In the name of Jesus the Lord.

(L) - Let us pray. God of wonder, you created all that is, the seen and the unseen, and in this you reveal to us the depth of your love. Open us more and more to see beyond the surface. Give us humility, that we might know you in and through an ever deepening appreciation of the meaning of the world which, in love, you made. Empower us with your spirit, that we might share with those you have put into our care, a knowledge and understanding that all things speak of your wisdom and love. Through our ministry may they live ever more abundantly, rejoicing in the divine presence which fills the whole creation.

We make this prayer through Christ our Lord. AMEN

LITURGY IN SCHOOL

NEWS FROM THE PRIMARY CORNER

Firstly two dates to remember: Friday 13 February "Theology for Teachers" on Scripture with Steve O'Brien. Then Wednesday 18 March is RE Co-ordinators' Day. The day will be given by an outside speaker and will centre on a new book just out called "Do You Love Me". It is a follow-up from the Year of Faith and has been written by the Spirituality Committee of our Bishops' Conference. Each of you will receive a copy on the day. It is in colour, not thick and no heavy reading! I will be touch later with more details, be sure to keep the date free.

Our next topic is a sacramental theme - the Eucharist. The Eucharist, Holy Communion and Blessed Sacrament are all different names for what we usually call holy communion. The word eucharist comes from the Greek meaning *thanksgiving* and is often used as an alternative for the celebration of Mass. The small white particle we call the "host" and we refer to it as an "unconsecrated host" or a "consecrated host" depending on whether it has been consecrated at a Mass or not. I would like to take this opportunity to refresh a few suggestions to ensure that when Mass is celebrated in school and at the Diocesan Mass, the children receive holy communion correctly. It would be good to have a few practices in school through all classes. Some people receive on the hand and others in the mouth. Most of the children receive on the hand. They should be reminded to answer "Amen" before receiving the host, and be told to put the host into their mouths immediately. For the Diocesan Masses we intend to have adults on either side of the Bishop in case a child forgets to consume the host and just walks away. This might be good practice for schools as well. In some places the children are instructed to make the sign of the cross as they walk away This is another help to remind the children about what they are doing. Praying after communion also need to be developed as the children get older.

SECONDARY RE AND INSPECTION

A Level/GCSE Consultation The CES [Catholic Education Service] has written to schools with regard to the recent consultation on the future of Religious Education at KS4 and KS5 in our schools. Along with the CES, the diocese would like to thank those of you who were able to complete the response and return it to the DfE. The responses from the RE community far exceed those of any other subject consultation, demonstrating the huge interest in and passion for the future of religious education. Catholic schools and diocese across England and Wales made a substantial contribution to the whole picture. Our firmly expressed views will, I hope, influence the development of the DfE subject criteria and subsequent specifications produced by the boards. We await the outcome.

People of God – Called to Serve The new KS3 Framework for RE is on schedule for publication of Year 7 in the middle of 2015, with Years 8+9 to follow in 2016. *People of God – Called to Serve*, published as a website by Mathew James, will provide departments with a carefully designed, modern framework for religious education at KS3 that is both challenging and aspirational and supported by a growing range of on-line resources. The very good news is that *People of God – Called to Serve* will be very affordable, initially costing £100.00 per school for a single year or £300.00 for three years. After 2015 the initial cost will rise to £200.00 and £100 for each subsequent year. I would encourage every school to budget for this very modest expenditure from April.

NCTL is currently offering scholarship for their Chairs' Leadership Development Programme, as follows. *1200 scholarships of up to 80% of the cost are available until the end of March 2015 for the Chairs of Governors' Leadership Development Programme*

The Chairs of Governors' Leadership Development Programme is for aspiring chairs of governors, new chairs or existing chairs who would like to develop their skills further.

The programme is delivered through workshops, school-based activities and includes the support of a mentor. It focuses on the role of the chair, leading the governing body and leading change and continuous improvement. The programme is delivered through NCTL approved licensees. We offer scholarship of £320 for small schools and £200 for all other maintained schools towards the cost of the programme.
